TOPIC: Western and Eastern Natural law influence on spirituality, mindfulness and sustainability with Richard Peregoy.

As we wrestle with the worldwide issue of sustainability, it seems helpful to return to the writings of Aristotle, Cicero, Aquinas, and Lao Tzu. Their thinking about natural law triggers a search for a current direction. Thus a "Big Question" arises? "How does the unchanging natural law (Western and Eastern) influence proposed effective action steps to address spirituality, mindfulness, and sustainability?" Other topics relevant to this Big Question include the role of mindfulness, how to change our mindset, and the approach of strategic management.
