AOM 2023 Boston PRACTICE-ORIENTED DOCTORAL CONSORTIUM (PDW) Call for Registration and Submissions

Session Attendance – By Invitation / Pre-Registration ONLY

Practice-oriented doctoral students face a unique set of dissertation challenges. Often seeking to either solve a specific business problem or close the theory/practice gap, the goal nonetheless centers on the creation of relevant and impactful research.

A specially designed practice-oriented workshop will take place on August 5 during the AOM 2023 in Boston. This session will begin with an overview of the challenges practice-oriented doctoral students face across the dissertation process phases, and then will allow registrants to receive feedback on your dissertation project from experienced practice-oriented academics.

Interested practice-oriented doctoral students are encouraged to submit a prospectus template of their doctoral dissertation work-in-progress (see submission information below). During the session, each registrant will receive specific feedback on their submission from attending scholar-practitioners and practice-oriented university professors. The session will close with advice and guidance for all attendees on those elements presented and considered in an outstanding practice-oriented dissertation.

Registration Process

Registrants must be currently enrolled in a Practice-oriented Doctorate programme AND have successfully defended your thesis proposal.

Registrants must also hold a currently valid AOM membership AND have registered to attend the Annual Meeting.

Applicants must complete the following template to submit their application – by the submission deadline of 1 July 2023:

NOTE: Participation in the Consortium is **by invitation only**, with space **limited to 20 students**.

•If more than 20 applications are received, participants will be selected based on the quality and the potential scholarly literature and/or practice contribution of the submission.

Agreement to have your paper's topic, literature review and research methodology shared among a small group for discussion purposes by the workshop facilitators is required – no level of confidentiality will be guaranteed to participants as part of the discussion.

If your proposal is accepted, you will receive further instructions. There is no additional cost to attend this PDW (other than the AOM Annual Conference registration).
