Start a tour of Chicago murals upon arrival at O'Hare Airport where Michael Hayden, Canadian artist, created a dreamy moving walkway in the United Airlines terminal.

Take a photo at Cloud Gate, known as "The Bean", Millennium Park's colossal metallic sculpture by Sir Anish Kapoor, a British artist in the 24.5 acre green space with a video display. The mirrorlike finish may inspire selfies.





This is the winding oriel staircase from the 12th to the 2nd floor of the Rookery Building, a Chicago Landmark added to the National Register of Historic Places in 1970. Tours are on Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays.

Navy Pier at 600 E. Grand Ave. on the shoreline of Lake Michigan offers a lighter side of the city with carnival rides, shops and food in a former Navy training center. From bands, to sunset Yoga and fireworks, the 3300 foot-long pier offers a lighter side of the city and evening breezes.




3 Arts Café at Restoration Hardware is a 70K-square-foot building where you should stroll with a glass of Champagne and enjoy a meal in a room with heritage olive trees and this refurbished historic fountain.



Shedd Aquarium is indoors with a vairety of habitats and views of Lake Michigan. Home to Pacific white-sided dolphins.



Step out on the 103rd story <u>Willis</u> <u>Tower SkyDeck</u> There is an unequal foundation load as the building leans about 4" to the west with a slight asymmetrical design. The John Hancock skyscraper also has a rooftop observation deck and restaurant.



Behind the below mural is the Caribbean River North Rum Club with cabarets Wednesday, Friday and Saturday nights into the wee hours.

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Improving Lives Via Responsible Research: A Debate on Responsible Research (RRBM Network at AOM 2017)

Recently a group of prominent scholars from several major business disciplines released a position paper entitled "A Vision of Responsible Research in Business and Management: Striving for Useful and Credible Knowledge." This PDW offers participants an opportunity to hear responses to the position paper from eleven former Presidents of the Academy of Management and to debate its implications for the Academy and for their own scholarship. This position paper argues that there is need for a research ecosystem that does more to encourage and enable responsible research—that is, research that is both useful and credible— because such an ecosystem is needed to maintain trust of our key stakeholders and the flow of resources from them and, ultimately, to enable management scholars to improve lives. More specifically, the position paper argues that more useful research will be that which addresses problems of concern to the broader society and that more credible research will be that which uses methods of highest rigor. The position paper also diagnoses why it is challenging to pursue both of these goals and provides possible remedies for easing the challenges.

This PDW is organized to generate discussion and debate on the prospect of creating such a responsible research ecosystem so that management research can contribute to improving people's lives.

Should our research be more responsible and what would an "ecosystem" for conducting responsible research look like? A group of eminent scholars from five core business disciplines in 23 universities from ten countries recently published a Position Paper that is available at this website: https://www.RRBM.network. Eleven former Academy of Management Presidents present competing perspectives on this Position Paper, and then host roundtable discussions aimed at identifying an ecosystem that would enable management scholarship to be more responsible and, ultimately, improve lives.
